Today's Hymnology: Resurrection Hymn Plagal 4th Mode (3rd Antiphon)

You descended from on high, O compassionate One, and condescended to be buried for three days, so that from the passions You might set us free. Our life and resurrection, O Lord, glory be to You.

At Entrance:

Come let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us O Son of God, who art risen from the dead! We chant to Thee, alleluia.

The Same (in Greek):

Ευλογητός εἶ, Χριστέ ο Θεός υμῶν, ο πανσόφους τοὺς ἀλιεῖς ἀναδείξας, καταπέμψας αὐτοῖς τὸ Πνεῦμα τὸ Ἅγιον, καὶ δι αὐτῶν τὴν οἰκουμένην σαγηνεύσας, Φιλάνθρωπε, δόξα σοι!

The Same (transliterated):

Evloyitós i, Hristé o Theós imón; o pansófous tous aliis anadhixas, katapémpsas aftis to pnévma to áyion, ke dhi aftón tin ikouménin sayinéfsas, Filánthrope, dhóxa si.

The Kontakion (taken from the "Lenten Triodion" trans. Mother Mary and Kallistos Ware)

Thou who hast sanctified by Thy birth a virgin womb and fittingly blessed the hands of Simeon, Thou art come, O Christ our God, and on this day hast saved us. Give peace to Thy commonwealth in time of battle and strengthen the Orthodox people whom Thou hast loved, O Thou alone who lovest mankind.

The Communion Hymn:

Praise the Lord from the Heavens. Alleluia.

The Reading is from St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy 3:10-15

TIMOTHY, my son, you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions, my sufferings, what befell me at Antioch, at Iconion, and at Lystra, what persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me. Indeed all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, while evil men and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived. But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings which are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

The Reading is from Luke 18:10-14

The Lord said this parable, "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

COMMUNION ETIQUETTE

If you are either baptized or confirmed as an Orthodox Christian and have spiritually prepared to receive Holy Communion, please come up the middle aisle of the Church with reverence and humility, as guided by the ushers, in a **QUIET** and **ORDERLY** fashion, and depart down the sides.

All those receiving Holy Communion must be confirmed Orthodox Christians. If you are married, your marriage must also have been blessed by the Orthodox Church.

In receiving Communion, recite your Christian name and wipe your mouth after receiving. Women, please remove your lipstick prior to receiving Holy Communion.
